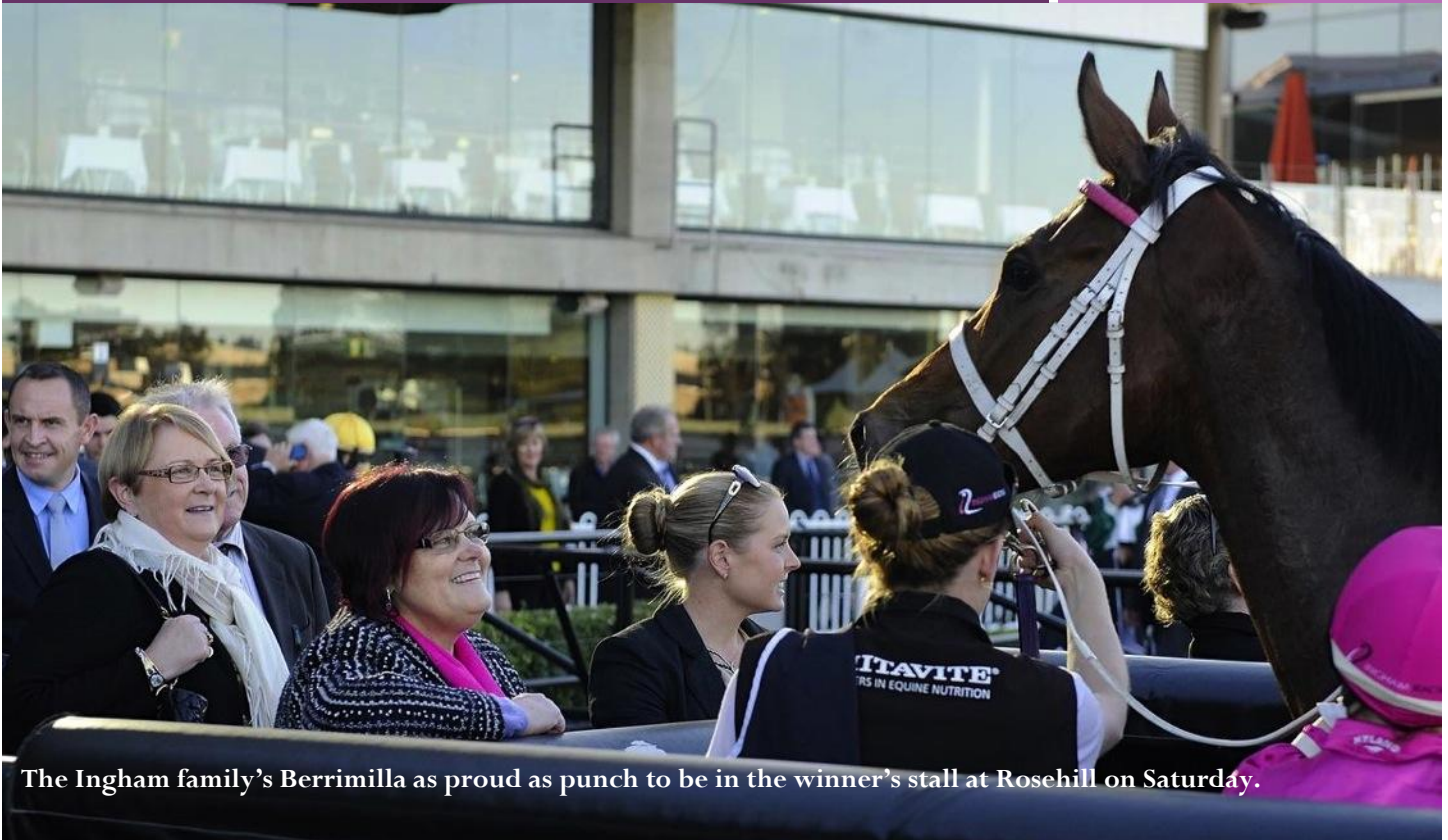

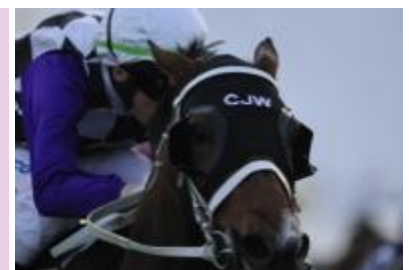

RELAXED AND HAPPY

With the top weight of 59kgs and stepping up to the 1400m, Mr CC Lai's Relaxed and Happy handled the task with ease in the hands of the in-form Nash Rawiller. Recording his second Saturday win this preparation, he secured one more valuable BOBs Bonus before the end of his 3yo season and is now enjoying a well-deserved spell at Boynton Park.

BERRIMILLA

The Ingham family's Berrimilla confirmed herself as a Saturday-class mare with a dominant win over 1350m at Rosehill on Saturday. Rated beautifully by Glyn Schofield, she charged down the outside of the track to win by 1.3 lengths. With her rating creeping up, for her next assignment she looks better placed in Melbourne so will be making the trip south to the Flemington stables soon.

SACRED FLYER

Another great ride from Glyn Schofield brought up a double for him on CWR horses at Rosehill on the day. Raffles Racing's Sacred Flyer proved too strong over the 2000m with stable-mate Lucripetous flashing down the inside for an impressive second. Sacred Flyer is likely to step out again over 2000m in a BM 90 at Rosehill on the 3rd of August before being freshened for something in the spring while Lucripetous backs up at Randwick this Saturday.

WAR HORSE

A raw talent, War Horse broke maiden ranks at Kembla Grange in what was his fifth start. Coming close last preparation, he finished second at Canterbury to stable mate Wind Bender at Canterbury before training off and heading for a spell. War Horse will return to Canterbury for his next start over 1600m on the 7th of August. With CWR runners filling the first four placings it was barn 3's mascot General Web who ran another honest second with promising filly Casiroill stiffed for third and debut runner Zataglio an eye-catching fourth.

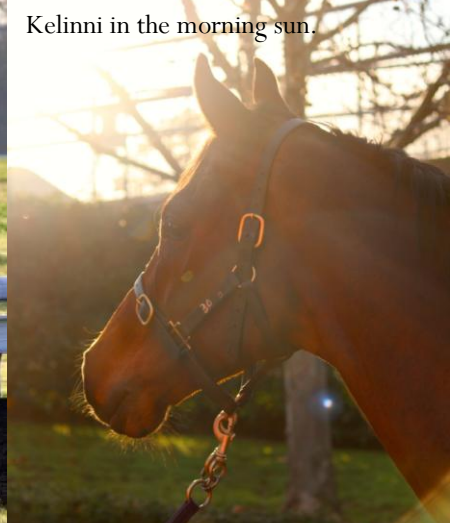
